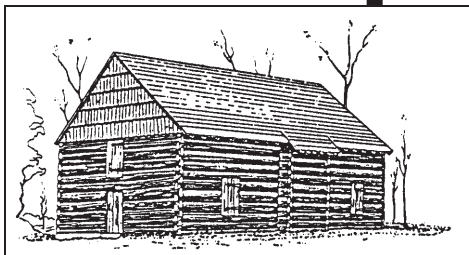

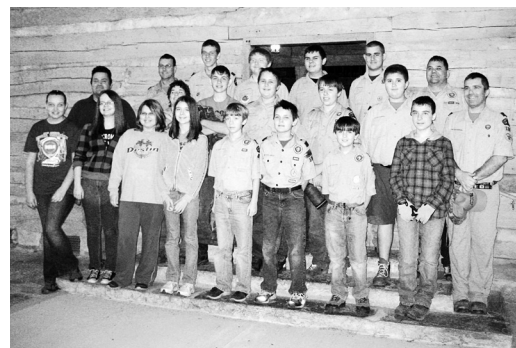
Bring a picnic lunch and enjoy the fellowship. There are picnic tables scattered about the grounds.

Notes from the Ridge

Two Centuries of Gifts Have Built Cane Ridge

We receive a lot of calls about various items people want to donate to Cane Ridge. Most are definitely things we'd like to receive, although, some items have no real relation to Cane Ridge or the Stone-Campbell Movement. In this issue are not only our financial donors but three people who donated books and two work groups who donated time. Our friend, Adalin Wichman (see article below) gave of her talent. All of these donations are valuable to Cane Ridge.

Sadly we cannot always take everything that is offered. Our archives and museum cannot currently contain all that we'd like to have. We are hoping to expand these areas in the next few years. We also hope to represent the particular area of the Bluegrass in which we reside. This year's Cane Ridge Day will highlight the connection, however slight, with Daniel Boone. (see front page)

Stone-Campbell History Arriving Early in 2013

Due in March 2013 the new publication, *The Stone-Campbell Movement: A Global History*, will be available from Chalice Press. The history, a major resource from the editors of the earlier *Encyclopedia of the Stone-Campbell Movement*. The Edi-

tors; D. Newell Williams, Douglas A. Foster, and Paul M. Blowers, have compiled a history of all three parts of the Stone-Campbell tradition. The impressive volume will be available for \$74.99. Digital and print versions are also available. For more information check ChalicePress.com.

Friend of Cane Ridge, Adalin Wichman, Passes Away

Adalin Wichman (1922-2013) passed away on March 10. A talented and sought-after artist in central Kentucky she was a Paris, Kentucky native. Although largely self-taught she was known for illustrations, portraits, animal paintings, jewelry designs and bronze sculptures. It was for her bronze work that Cane



Ridge will be forever indebted. When seeking an adequate way of celebrating the time of Franklin and Rachael McGuire as curators a bust of Barton Warren Stone was commissioned by Mrs. Wichman. The bust was installed on the grounds in 2001, with a native limestone plinth and a bronze plaque at the base. Remarkably the bust is based upon a single oil painting and a handful of engravings of Barton Stone.

Popular photography was in its infancy when Stone died in 1844 and no known photos exist. One or two other paintings have been purported to be of him but they are almost all of other, although they may have been relatives. Many Barton Stones have been named for him. Mrs. Wichman's talent will long represent the history of Cane Ridge and Barton W. Stone.

The Kentucky Bucket List

More than a year after the Lexington Herald-Leader placed the Cane Ridge Meeting House on its Bucket List of places to see in the Bluegrass the Meeting House is honored to once again appear on a bucket list. Published in late 2012, *The Kentucky Bucket List, 100 Ways to Have a Real Kentucky Experience*, by Michael Crisp, was published by Remix Books of Georgetown, KY. The Meeting House is number 54 out of 100 although the list is in no particular order. As an homage to the most

iconic Kentucky bucket, that of Kentucky Fried Chicken, the cover shows a familiar red and white bucket.

Noting the peace inside, the book recommends sitting inside the Meeting House. Each entry has a quote helping to describe the experience. Ralph Waldo Emerson is quoted as saying, "I like the silent church before the service begins, better than any preaching." Come visit and experience this recommendation.

Archives Receives Donations

The Cane Ridge Archives were gifted with two books from trustee **Larry Taul** of Mt. Sterling, KY. The first is *Work and Worship, The Economic Order of the Shakers* by Edward Deming Andrews and Faith Andrews. The second had been owned by Rev. Frank M. Tinder who had served many Kentucky congregations in the early 1900's. Tinder gave the book to Henry A. Taul and was passed down to Larry. *The Family, A Necessity of Civilization* was written in 1896 by Rev. John B. Robins and published by the Fleming H. Revell, Co.

In addition **Dr. Jerry Sumney**, Professor of New Testament at Lexington Theological Seminary donated a copy of the 1851 edition of *Christian Baptism: with its Antecedents and Consequents* by Alexander Campbell and a copy of *Campbell's Popular Lectures and Address*, published in 1866. Retired minister, **David Alexander**, has also given numerous items related to the Concord Church which his family had long been associated with and which was served by Barton W. Stone. Concord was the sister congregation to Cane Ridge. A Presbyterian Church Hymnal from 1861 has a notation which says it was the property of Concord Church. He also donated several books including: *The Disciples in Kentucky* by A.W. Fortune, *The Living Oracles*, 3rd edition, edited by Alexander Campbell, A 1908 zinc etching reprint of the *Declaration and Address* by Thomas Campbell and portions of an early edition of *The Biography of Barton Warren Stone*.
